**Dunkeld Flood Protection Scheme Community Drop-In Sessions**

Perth and Kinross Council is keen to consult with local residents and businesses in Dunkeld regarding the progress of the Dunkeld Flood Protection Scheme.

In December 2021, SEPA published the Tay Flood Risk Management (FRM) Plan and in December 2022, the Council published the Tay Local FRM Plan. Both documents can be viewed via <https://www.pkc.gov.uk/frmplans> and include the requirement for a 'Flood Study' for Dunkeld as one of the selected actions for managing flood risk in the area.

The Council engaged consulting engineers, AECOM, to develop the Flood Study. The aim of this study was to improve our understanding of flood risk in the area, assess the potential options for managing the identified risk and to provide recommendations for flood protection measures within the catchment. The Dunkeld Flood Protection Study was updated and finalised, and the conclusions and recommendations of the study were approved at the Climate Change and Sustainability Committee on 31 May 2023.

On 28 February 2024, Perth and Kinross Council took the decision to invest £1M to bring forward the delivery of the recommended Dunkeld and Craigie Burn flood protection schemes.

In April 2025, the council engaged consulting engineers, AECOM, to develop the Flood Scheme. Details of the progress of the Scheme can be found at <https://www.pkc.gov.uk/article/24017/Dunkeld-Flood-Protection-Scheme>, along with a scheme delivery timetable.

The Council would now like to share draft Flood Scheme documents with the local community in order to get feedback on the work completed to date.

**Community drop-in sessions will also be held at the Atholl Arms Hotel and Residence, Bridgehead, Tay Terrace, Dunkeld, Perth & Kinross, PH8 0AQ on **Wednesday 10 June 2026** from 3pm until 7pm and **Tuesday 16 June 2026** from 3pm until 7pm.**

The consultation materials will also be available to view on the Council's Consultation Hub at <https://consult.pkc.gov.uk/communities/dunkeldfloodscheme> . The Consultation Hub will go live by no later than 5pm on Tuesday 09 June 2026.

Council officers will be present, along with representatives from AECOM, to provide an opportunity for affected parties to learn more about the scheme outcomes and ask any questions. Additionally, the following partner agencies have been invited to attend:

- Scottish Water - to provide answers to any queries on the sewer network;
- The Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA) - to provide advice on Flood Line, and the Scottish Flood Forecast;
- The Scottish Flood Forum (SFF), an independent organisation which supports individuals and communities at risk from flooding - to provide advice on flood resilience products.

We would encourage affected parties to read the Dunkeld Flood Protection Scheme materials available and attend the community drop-in session, if possible, prior to providing their views and comments.

**We would ask that comments are returned to the Council by Wednesday 01 July 2026.**

Affected parties are encouraged to submit their comments through the Consultation Hub, although paper and email submissions will also be accepted. A comment form is attached, and affected parties are encouraged to engage with the process and to submit their views accordingly.

The Flood Scheme will then be further developed and then constructed with consideration of any valuable consultation responses received from the community.
