Pitlochry and Moulin Community Council welcomes the opportunity to comment on Perth and Kinross Council's proposal to transfer ownership of Pitlochry Town Hall from the Pitlochry Common Good Fund to the local community.

The Community Council fully supports this proposal.

Pitlochry Town Hall is a valued and historic community asset that has served generations of local residents and visitors. We believe that transferring ownership to the local community represents a positive and forward-looking step that will help safeguard the building's long-term future while ensuring it continues to serve the needs and aspirations of the people of Pitlochry and Moulin.
